Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The arrangements for safeguarding are not effective. The safeguarding policy is unclear and the designated safeguarding person does not know the correct procedure to follow if there is an allegation made against a member of staff. In addition, staff are unaware that they must disclose any changes to their suitability to work with children.
- The management team has failed to keep all documentation accessible and available for inspection. As a result, there is no evidence to show a robust recruitment process is in place and that staff are recruited safely.
- Staff understand the importance of planning a wide and varied programme of activities for children. Staff discuss the different ways children learn, how their interests inform planning and how they adapt activities for children's different styles of learning.
- Staff show a suitable understanding of how to manage children's individual welfare needs. For example, they understand children's dietary needs and the importance of teaching children to respect, tolerate and care for each other. In addition, staff demonstrate an understanding of how to support children emotionally.
- Staff have created effective partnerships with the school that children attend. Staff consider children's learning at school and complement this through planning activities to extend their learning further.
- Staff are well qualified and experienced in working with children. They are keen to attend training and are aware of areas of provision that they are working on to improve.
- Partnerships with parents are a high priority. Staff take time to talk to parents and relay information about each child's school day and the activities they have enjoyed while attending the session.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Mrs B's @ Barley Fields was registered in 2007. The setting employs 10 members of childcare staff. Of these, six hold appropriate early years qualifications at level 2 or above. The setting opens from Monday to Friday all year round. Sessions are from 7.30am until 9am and 3.20pm until 6pm during term time. In the school holidays, sessions are from 8am until 6pm.
