Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has clear procedures to follow should she have any safeguarding concerns about children's welfare, to protect them from harm.
- The childminder understands how to observe and assess children's learning, and plan for their individual needs, to help them make good progress. She knows how to provide a welcoming and stimulating environment.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's good health and well-being, such as through providing healthy nutritious foods and promoting physical exercise.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents to share information and promote continuity.
- The childminder understands how to complete risk assessments to ensure her premises are safe for children. She knows how to manage children's behaviour and the importance of teaching children to take turns, share and respect others.
- The childminder knows the importance of evaluating her practice, to help identify her strengths and areas for development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed the areas of the setting, and looked at the resources and equipment the childminder intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to observe, assess and plan for children's learning.
- The inspector sampled a range of documents, including the childminder's policies and procedures, risk assessments, suitability checks and her qualifications.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she evaluates and reflects on her practice.
