The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how children learn and develop. She knows how to plan activities and support all children to make progress. The childminder is aware of how to help them gain the skills needed for their future learning, including the move to school.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to safeguard children. For example, she knows what actions to take if she is concerned about a child's welfare.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and sharing information about children's progress.
- The childminder knows how to support children's physical and emotional well-being. For example, she understands the importance of healthy food and exercise, and that children need to feel settled and happy in her care.
- The childminder knows how to manage children's behaviour. For instance, they learn to share, take turns and consider the needs of others.
- The childminder understands the importance of keeping her skills and knowledge up to date and the value of training in improving her practice still further.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
