Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the importance of evaluating her provision and has addressed the actions set at the last inspection. She reads professional publications as one way of keeping up to date with any changes to legislation and good practice.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge of how to keep children safe. She is able to demonstrate a clear understanding of child protection procedures. The childminder knows who she should contact if she has a concern about the welfare of a child in her care.
- The childminder has a sound understanding of the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She demonstrates a secure knowledge of how children learn and develop. She explains how she would provide children with a wide range of stimulating activities based on their interests and needs.
- The childminder has systems in place to promote children's safety and welfare. She has a selection of suitable policies and procedures in place to underpin her practice.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's physical development. She understands the importance of ensuring children enjoy a healthy and balanced diet. She is able to discuss the regular opportunities children will have to play and exercise outside when they are in her care.
- The childminder demonstrates an awareness of how to support children's well-being. She talks about how she helps them to build positive relationships with each other, be independent and to make choices and decisions. The childminder has a good understanding of how to manage children's behaviour positively.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector took a tour of the areas used for childminding children. She viewed the resources and equipment available for children to use.
- The inspector spoke with the childminder to discuss and review a range of documents, including policies, risk assessment and children's records
- The inspector reviewed evidence of the childminder's suitability and her qualifications, including paediatric first aid.
