Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to provide a broad variety of activities and resources to encourage children's interests and skills. She is aware of the need to encourage children to develop their independence, and make choices, during their play.
- The childminder knows how to observe and assess children's developmental progress to identify learning priorities for children. She is aware of how to use this information to plan activities around children's interests to help them make progress.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of her safeguarding role. She knows what action to take if she is concerned about the welfare of children. Comprehensive risk assessments are undertaken to provide a safe environment for their play.
- The childminder reflects on her provision and plans improvements to her service. For example, she regularly attends training to develop her knowledge and skills further.
- The childminder is aware of the need to encourage mutual respect and tolerance. She understands the importance of helping children to learn to recognise and express their feelings in acceptable ways.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
