Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the importance of monitoring children's progress and tracking their learning. She knows how to provide a good range of activities and experiences to help children make good progress in their learning and development.
- The childminder understands the importance of sharing information. She understands how to establish positive communication with parents and other early years professionals to help provide children with a good level of consistency of care.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of safeguarding children, to promote their welfare and the procedures to protect them from harm. She understands how to support them to stay safe in her care and provide a suitable environment for them.
- The childminder is aware of how to evaluate her practice and continue her own professional development. For example, she reviews her environment and current practice, and attends a variety of training courses to improve her knowledge.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of how to support children to behave well and respect others, such as sharing, taking turns and respecting boundaries.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector looked at the policies and documents that the childminder will use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed how the childminder will build positive partnerships with parents and other professionals.
