Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements and knows the correct procedures to follow to safeguard children's welfare.
- The childminder knows how to assess, plan and promote children's learning, in partnership with parents, to help children make good progress and promote their readiness for school.
- The childminder recognises the importance of helping children develop healthy lifestyles. For example, she provides lots of outdoor play, gardening projects and outings in the city.
- The childminder provides secure premises with safety measures in place to keep children safe and secure.
- The childminder provides resources to promote all areas of learning and arranges outings to broaden children's learning experiences.
- The childminder evaluates her practice and extends her knowledge and skills through personal development to make improvements to the quality of her provision.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder to assess her knowledge of the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she promotes children's learning and development.
- The inspector looked at the documents the childminder uses when caring for children and discussed her policies.
- The inspector looked at the space available for childminding and the resources she uses.
