## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to promote children's learning. She understands how to observe and assess their development to plan for the next stages in their learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals. She actively seeks their views to help her to reflect on her practice and drive continuous improvements.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge of safeguarding children. She knows how to recognise signs that a child may be at risk and how to report any concerns.
- The childminder understands how to follow suitable hygiene practices and how to promote children's health and well-being.
- The childminder undertakes training to gain qualifications and to ensure her continuous professional development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector looked at the areas of the premises which are available for children's use.
- The inspector checked documentation required such as staff suitability and qualifications, insurance and other policies and procedures.
- The inspector discussed with the provider her knowledge and understanding of safeguarding, and what she would do in the event of a concern.
- The inspector discussed with the provider her understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage and how she promotes children's learning.
