Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The manager and staff understand their roles and responsibilities in keeping children safe and protecting them from harm. They also recognise the importance of undertaking risk assessments to help children play in safety.
- The manager is aware of the need to provide an age-appropriate range of activities, resources and learning experiences for children. She understands the importance of supporting the children and to build on what they are doing at school.
- The manager and staff know their role in supporting children's well-being. They know how to maintain children's good health and to continue to promote their physical development with activities both inside and outdoors.
- The manager understands the need to have good partnerships with parents and other important persons involved in the children's lives, to help ensure consistent care.
- The manager knows she needs to continually develop the provision and ensure that children are offered good-quality care and the opportunities to explore and continue and build on their learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector looked at the range of toys and activities that will be available to the children.
- The inspector held discussions with the manager about planning children's activities, and how she proposes to work with parents and others.
- The inspector sampled documentation and discussed these with the manager.
- The inspector discussed the provision's safeguarding and child protection procedures, how children's good health will be maintained and how children's behaviour will be managed.
- The inspector discussed the process for monitoring the quality of her provision and any plans made for future improvement.

Deptford Park After School Club is run by the Deptford Primary School and operates at the school in Deptford, Lewisham. The club accepts children from Deptford Park and another local school. The club operates Monday to Friday term time only from 3.30pm to 6pm. A total of five staff work with the children. The manager holds a National Vocational Qualification at level 3, other members of staff all hold a level 2 qualification. At the time of the inspection there were no children in the early years age group on roll.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the Early Years Foundation Stage.
