## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has allowed her paediatric first-aid qualification and public liability insurance to expire. These are also breaches of the Childcare Register requirements.
- The childminder knows how to put measures in place to reduce accidents to children. Her home is free from hazards. The childminder understands child protection issues, including the procedures for making referrals if a child is at risk of harm.
- The childminder knows how to promote the good health of children through daily routines, food and drink and exercise. The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour and teach them to respect others.
- The childminder recognise the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to promote consistency of care and learning for children.
- The childminder knows how to use assessments to support children's learning. She also understands how to provide play opportunities to help children to be ready for school.
- The childminder is keen to evaluate her practice to identify targets to in order to drive improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
