### Summary of key findings for parents

#### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates, through discussion, a sound knowledge of her role in safeguarding children.
- The childminder has a suitable range of toys, which are stored appropriately, for children to access independently. The childminder has experience of planning activities based on the children's interests, such as cooking, gardening and sports events.
- The childminder knows how to assess and monitor the children's progress.
- The childminder has arrangements to share observations of the children with parents. She recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents to support the care and learning needs of the children.
- The childminder, through discussion, demonstrates that she knows how to manage children's behaviour appropriately.
- The childminder understands the importance of reflecting on the quality of her service to identify any areas for improvement.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
