## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a thorough knowledge of the safeguarding and welfare requirements. She understands the procedures to follow should she have child protection concerns, and makes sure her assistant is also aware of these.
- The childminder understands how to plan interesting activities that build on children's existing skills and knowledge. She recognises the importance of having effective monitoring processes, to ensure children continue to make progress.
- The childminder has a wide range of resources to support and challenge children of all ages, indoors and outdoors.
- The childminder understands the importance of developing strong relationships with parents, and involving them in their children's care and development.
- The childminder understands the importance of effective self-evaluation to help her make ongoing improvements. She is well motivated and makes sure she and her assistant are up-to-date with any changes to legislation and best practice guidance.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

She works with an assistant. There were no children, in the early years age range, on roll at the time of the inspection.
