She recognises the importance of providing opportunities for physical play and a secure and welcoming environment for children. The childminder knows how to help children develop strong relationships to support their emotional well-being.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other settings involved with children, in order to provide a shared approach to children's learning and development.
- The childminder understands the importance of evaluating her provision to make continuous improvements. She has addressed the recommendations and action made at the last inspection.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation.
