Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has clear procedures to follow, should she have any safeguarding concerns about children's welfare.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's good health and well-being. For example, she has arrangements to provide nutritious foods and promote physical exercise.
- The childminder understands how to complete risk assessments to ensure her premises are safe for children. She knows how to manage children's behaviour, for example, she teaches children to take turns, share and respect others.
- The childminder understands how to reflect on her practice and gather the views of parents and children to help make improvements. She describes a range of professional development opportunities that she is involved in or she intends to explore, in order to support and develop her practice.
- The childminder has systems to assess children's progress and to plan activities to promote their next steps in learning. She understands the importance of establishing links with parents and other settings children attend, to promote continuity in learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the premises and checked all areas available for childminding.
- The inspector spoke to the childminder about how she intends to continue to improve her service and develop her skills further.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's arrangements for keeping children safe.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to work with parents and other professionals.
