Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to check her practice and the importance of continuing to develop her knowledge and skills, such as through training. She understands the need to evaluate what she does and to identify what changes she might make to improve children's experiences and help them make progress.
- The childminder has kept her knowledge up to date about how children learn and develop, changes to legislation and curriculum requirements.
- The childminder knows the procedures to follow if she had any concerns for a child's well-being. She understands how to assess and manage risks to meet the needs of different children. She knows how to keep children safe.
- The childminder knows the importance of providing a welcoming environment for the children. She understands the need to provide a range of resources that meet the needs of children with different ages, abilities and backgrounds. She knows how to manage children's behaviour and to teach them to respect others.
- The childminder knows to assess children's starting points to help her plan activities to help children progress in readiness for school.
- The childminder understands the importance of establishing relationships with parents and other professionals involved with the children to meet children's care and learning needs.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector toured the premises with the childminder, and viewed a range of resources, toys and equipment used for childminding.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her knowledge and understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
