Summary of key findings for parents

#### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has an excellent knowledge of child protection procedures. She shares her policies with parents and is clear about the correct procedures to follow should concerns arise, including any allegations made against herself or a family member. She has considered the safe use of mobile phones and cameras as part of her safeguarding process.
- The childminder has a current first-aid certificate and public liability insurance. Risk assessments are thorough and the childminder identifies hazards and takes appropriate action to minimise risks to children.
- The childminder has thorough understanding of the learning and development requirements and how children learn in different ways. She is aware of being alert to gaps in children's learning and how to take prompt action to reduce these guickly. Effective systems are in place to share information with parents so that children benefit from a shared approach to their care and learning.
- The childminder's home is welcoming, stimulating and well equipped. Resources are stored at heights appropriate for specific ages of children. The childminder knows how to promote healthy lifestyles. She plans to provide healthy and nutritious food and daily opportunities for children to enjoy physical exercise.
- The childminder knows how to manage children's behaviour positively. She knows how to help children build relationships, encouraging them to consider the needs of others and to share and take turns.
- The childminder is committed and recognises the importance of accessing professional development opportunities. She knows how to evaluate her practice, for example, through receiving suggestions from parents, children, other childminders and professionals.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
