Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has robust systems in place to identify risks and minimise hazards to children's safety. She has an up-to-date safeguarding understanding of local child protection procedures and knows what to do if she had concerns for children's safety or welfare.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of how to provide children with play and learning opportunities to help them develop their skills and knowledge, in preparation for moving onto school.
- The childminder has appropriate arrangements to monitor and review the quality of her practice and extend her knowledge and skills. For example, she will ask parents to regularly share their views with her and attend early years training.
- The childminder understands the importance of working with parents and other settings to support children to make good progress.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's behaviour and help children to develop a respect for each other.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
