## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has limited understanding about child protection issues. She lacks understanding of the procedures to follow and who to contact if an allegation is made against herself or a family member. She has not considered the safe use of mobile phones or cameras as part of robust safeguarding procedures.
- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements. She knows how to assess children's ability and progress. She recognises how to plan a range of activities that covers all areas of learning.
- The premises are securely maintained. The childminder has appropriate risk assessment procedures and safety equipment in place. She understands the importance of making sure the areas children will use, are safe for them to play in.
- The childminder has a reasonable understanding of how to promote children's good health. She explains how she would encourage outdoor physical play, healthy eating habits and effective hygiene procedures.
- The childminder demonstrates a clear understanding of working in partnership with parents and other providers. She talks about the reasons for sharing information about children's learning and care.
- The childminder understands the need to evaluate her provision and ensure continuous improvement.
- The childminder explains how she will make sure that children are made aware of expectations for behaviour. She understands the importance of helping children to consider the feelings of others.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

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# What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:

- The inspector sampled relevant documentation that the childminder will use to support children's learning and development and assess their progress.
