Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to promote the learning and development of all children. She is aware of how to use observations and assessments to monitor children's progress and to plan for their next steps in learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of working closely with parents and keeping them involved in their children's learning.
- The childminder knows her role in safeguarding children. She understands the procedures to follow in the event of a concern about a child in her care. In addition, she regularly assesses and reduces any risks in her home.
- The childminder undertakes regular training to keep her knowledge up to date and is aware of reflecting on her practice to help her continually improve.
- The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour and the need to teach them how to be kind, caring and have respect for others.
- The childminder understands the need to promote healthy lifestyles and ensuring children are physically active. In addition, she is aware of the benefits of children having nutritious meals and snacks.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The childminder registered in 1998. She lives in North Kensington, in the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea. The childminder works with an assistant. The childminder is available to care for children Monday to Friday, from 8am to 6pm, and operates all year round, except for bank or family holidays. At the time of the inspection, there were no children on roll in the early years age range.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
