The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to use observations and assessments to plan for children's next stage in learning. She understands how to monitor children's progress to help her identify and address any gaps in their learning.
- The childminder recognises the value of working in partnership with parents to help provide a consistent approach to children's care and learning. She plans to provide parents with regular feedback about their children's development.
- The childminder is aware of how to prepare children for their move to school or nursery. For example, she knows the importance of promoting their personal care skills.
- The childminder knows how to manage children's behaviour. For example, she plans to provide children with clear guidance and explanations to help them learn to manage their own behaviour.
- The childminder understands the possible signs that may raise her concerns about a child's welfare and the safeguarding procedures to follow to manage these.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
