## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements. She knows how to evaluate activities, observe, assess and plan the next steps in children's learning to help them prepare for their future steps in education.
- The childminder understands the need to work closely with parents and other professionals to promote consistency in their care, learning and development. For example, she recognises the importance of supporting children and their parents who learn English as an additional language.
- The childminder evaluates her practice and recognises the importance of seeking the views of parents and children to raise the quality of teaching further.
- The childminder knows how to encourage children's positive behaviour and teach them to respect and value each other's differences. She understands the need to provide children with plenty of opportunities for exercise and a healthy diet.
- The childminder knows what to do should she have any concerns about children's welfare or safety.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector looked at range of documentation the childminder plans to use when caring for children, including risk assessments, and policies and procedures.
- The inspector viewed the premises and resources available for children.
- The inspector looked at suitability checks and discussed safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her knowledge of the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements.
