## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibilities to meet the safeguarding and welfare requirements and understands how to support children's health, safety and well-being.
- The childminder understands her safeguarding responsibilities. She knows what to do if she has a concern about a child in her care. The childminder holds a paediatric first-aid qualification and knows how to treat minor injuries and accidents.
- The childminder understands the importance of evaluating her practice, and updating her skills and knowledge, such as through training and research. She knows the importance of working with parents and other professionals to promote continuity in children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands how to promote equality and diversity. She knows how to help children learn to respect each other and understand similarity and differences.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of providing suitable resources and experiences to help children make progress and prepare them for the next stage in their learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector viewed the childminder's home and her resources.
- The inspector spoke to the childminder about her knowledge of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
