Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not maintained a relevant first aid qualification and does not have valid public liability insurance. In addition, she does not have appropriate fire detection and safety equipment to keep children safe. These are also breaches of the Childcare Register.
- The childminder understands child protection issues, including the procedures to follow in relation to reporting any welfare concerns.
- The childminder knows how to help children learn to behave responsibly and develop a positive attitude towards diversity.
- The childminder knows how to assess children's abilities and provide activities to help them make progress in their learning and development. The childminder understand the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to provide consistent care and learning for children.
- The childminder is aware of her strengths and recognises how she can develop her practice to make improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:
