## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has failed to provide Ofsted with the information about a person in the household aged 16 years or over, in order for the full suitability process to be completed.
- The childminder reflects on her own practice but does not ensure that she meets all statutory requirements. She builds on the skills and knowledge gained from her experience and her initial childminding course by accessing training and other information sources.
- The childminder has a sound knowledge of how to report any safeguarding concerns about children and understands why it is important to help protect their welfare. All required policies for safeguarding children's welfare are in place.
- The childminder understands why it is important to minimise potential hazards and the possibility of accidents to children. She knows why it is important to teach children how to manage their own safety in a variety of situations. The childminder has a valid qualification in paediatric first aid.
- The childminder understands why children need to learn about the factors that promote their good health and hygiene. She recognises why children benefit from developing self-care skills and independence, as part of their readiness for the move on to school.
- The childminder explains how she will support children's emotional well-being, in order to help them gain a positive view of diversity and respect any differences between themselves and others. She knows why it is important to teach children how to manage their feelings and behaviour and to observe rules.
- The childminder has a good knowledge of how to promote children's learning and their readiness for the move on to school. She knows how to use observations and assessment to help identify children's next steps in learning and further their progress. The childminder recognises the importance of parents contributing to their children's learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## What the setting needs to do to improve further

**To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:**

The childminder was registered in 2006 and lives in the Stretford area of Trafford, Greater Manchester. The childminder operates from 9am to 5pm Monday to Friday, during term time. In school holidays, the childminder operates from 9am to 5pm, for up to three days a week from Monday to Friday, as needed.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
