## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has suitable knowledge of the safeguarding and welfare requirements. She understands the procedures to follow should she have child protection concerns, and makes her safeguarding policies available to parents.
- The childminder understands how to plan learning activities that build on children's existing skills and knowledge. She recognises the importance of having effective monitoring processes to ensure children make progress.
- The childminder has a suitable range of resources to support learning for all ages, indoors and outdoors.
- The childminder understands the importance of developing relationships with parents, and involving them in their children's learning.
- The childminder has considered how she will monitor her practice and identify areas for improvement. She understands the importance of effective self-evaluation in improving outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed the childminder's understanding of the safeguarding and welfare, and learning and development requirements.
- The inspector examined a range of documentation, policies and procedures, including those relating to safeguarding.
- The inspector viewed the premises and resources used for childminding.
