#### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder's home is free from hazards. She knows how to use safety checks indoors and outdoors to reduce hazards to children.
- The childminder understands the signs that may indicate a child's welfare is at risk and knows how to follow the appropriate procedures if she has concerns. The childminder knows how to implement hygiene practices. She understands the importance of healthy eating and daily exercises to promote children's health.
- The childminder knows how to carry out observations, plan activities and provide ageappropriate resources to support children to make progress in all areas of learning.
- The childminder has strategies to manage children's behaviour and to help them learn to respect others.
- The childminder knows the importance of working in partnership with parents to meet children's individual needs and provide consistency of care.
- The childminder has addressed the action and recommendations set at the last inspection. She demonstrates an ability to improve outcomes for children through an evaluation of her practice and attending training courses to develop her skills.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
