# Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder regularly updates her knowledge and understanding of safeguarding issues. She is aware of the signs that a child may be at risk of harm and how to report a concern.
- The childminder has a thorough understanding of how children learn and develop. She has clear systems in place to plan for children's individual needs and stage of development.
- Systems to monitor children's progress are in place and the childminder is confident in delivering a broad and balanced curriculum to support children to be ready for school.
- The childminder knows how to promote healthy lifestyles, for example, by providing regular opportunities for children to play and exercise outdoors.
- The childminder understands the importance of establishing partnerships with parents to provide consistent care and learning for children.
- The childminder understands the role of self-evaluation and intends to attend training courses to develop her knowledge further.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
