## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to observe and monitor children's progress, to help her plan and provide a range of activities to promote their learning.
- The childminder knows what to do if she has a concern about the welfare of a child. She understands how to keep children safe and undertakes regular assessments of the environment to help her minimise hazards.
- The childminder is committed to improving outcomes for children, for example, she undertakes training to update her knowledge and skills.
- The childminder understands how to help children feel safe and secure, and prepare them for their future learning. She recognises how to encourage children to develop an understanding managing their behaviour, for example, through talking about their feelings and emotions.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working with parents and other early years settings to help her to meet children's individual care and learning needs.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder about how she plans to meet children's individual care needs.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's knowledge and understanding of safeguarding children.
