Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a suitable knowledge of the requirements and knows the correct procedures to follow to help safeguard children's welfare.
- The childminder knows how to assess children's learning in partnership with parents from the start. She understands how to plan challenging experiences to help children make progress in all areas and to promote their future learning.
- The childminder understands how to work in partnership with parents to support children's emotional well-being. She obtains information about children's health and food preferences to provide suitable meals.
- The childminder understands how to use her premises and resources to provide the required space for children to play and move around freely and safely. She understands how to minimise hazards to keep children safe in all areas of her home.
- The childminder recognises the value of evaluating of her provision and keeping up-to-date with changes in legislation to meet children's needs.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder to assess her knowledge of the early years foundation stage requirements, and improvements made since the last inspection.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to promote children's learning and development.
- The inspector looked at the documents the childminder plans to use when caring for children and discussed her policies.
- The inspector looked at the space available for childminding and the resources she will use.
