## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to observe and assess children's abilities. She knows how to address any gaps to help children catch up. The childminder understands how to prepare children for the next stages in their learning.
- The childminder has a wide range of resources available to support all areas of learning and to help children learn about different people, their communities and cultures.
- The childminder conducts regular checks on her home and resources to help minimise risks. She knows the correct procedures to follow if she has any welfare concerns.
- The childminder knows the value of working in partnerships with parents, other providers and outside professionals, when relevant, to help promote continuity of care and learning for individual children.
- The childminder attends regular training courses to update her knowledge. For example, she attended training to help her further promote her understanding of how children learn through play. She recognises the importance of seeking the views of parents, children and others to improve her service.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector conducted a tour around the premises used for childminding with the childminder.
- The inspector checked the childminder's policies and procedures, including safeguarding.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's skills and knowledge of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- The inspector checked evidence of suitability and training for childminder and suitability of adults living on premises.
