## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder's home is safe and secure. She understands her role to promote children's safety and understands child protection issues. This includes procedures to record concerns and make a referral if she suspects that a child is at risk of harm.
- Procedures to promote children's good health through daily routines are well understood by the childminder.
- The childminder has a suitable range of resources. She knows how to use the two-year-old progress checks and general assessments to support and extend children's learning across different areas of their development.
- The childminder knows how to use suitable ways to manage children's behaviour, teach, and develop their awareness of others from differing backgrounds.
- Working in partnership with parents, schools and other providers to promote continuity of care and learning for children is well understood by the childminder.
- The childminder has addressed the actions and recommendations set at the last inspection. She demonstrates that she is able to develop her skills through training and to evaluate her practice to drive improvement.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector had discussions with the childminder about her childcare practices.
- The inspector viewed the furniture, toys and equipment for children to use.
- The inspector sampled a range of documentation, including qualification and training certificates, assessment reports and a relevant insurance certificate.
