# Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder recognises the need to work in partnership with parents and other early years professionals to ensure children's individual care and development needs are met.
- The childminder understands the importance of continuous improvement. For example, she reads relevant childcare publications and attends training.
- The childminder knows how to support and complement children's learning needs to ensure they continue to make progress.
- The childminder is aware that she needs to provide a safe and secure environment with age appropriate resources. She understands how to plan interesting activities that children enjoy and to challenge their abilities.
- The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour and help them develop independence and social skills.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
