Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not have an up-to-date paediatric first-aid qualification, as required. This is also a breach of the Childcare Register requirements.
- The childminder understands the procedures to follow to safeguard children. She is aware of the action to take should she have any concerns. The childminder completes risk assessments and take appropriate measures to minimise risks to children.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's learning. She knows how to assess and monitor children's development and plan a variety of activities to help them to make progress.
- The childminder knows how to manage children's behaviour and build their confidence and self-esteem. She knows how to support children to lead healthy lifestyles.
- The childminder understands the importance of working effectively with parents. She recognises the importance of sharing information regularly to support continuity in children's progress and well-being.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
