Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- Since the last inspection, the childminder has taken steps to develop her understanding of the learning and development requirements. She shows understanding of how to use assessment to adapt and plan activities to support children of all ages and abilities to make progress, in readiness for school.
- The childminder understands her responsibilities to meet the safeguarding and welfare requirements; she has clear procedures in place should she have a concern about children's welfare.
- The childminder plans to keep parents regularly informed about their children's individual care and learning needs to support continuity and home learning.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's communication and language, and how to work with other professionals, to close any gaps in children's development.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's behaviour and social skills.
- The childminder has measures in place to reflect on her practice and identify ways to improve.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed the premises and resources that the childminder intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder to explore her understanding of the early years foundation stage requirements.
- The inspector looked at relevant documentation, including a selection of policies and procedures.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's self-evaluation and professional development.
- The inspector held discussions to establish the childminder's knowledge of teaching, learning and assessment.
