- The childminder recognises the benefits of evaluating her practice. She explains how she includes the views of parents to help identify areas for improvement. She understands the importance of continuing to develop new skills and knowledge. She seeks training opportunities and keeps up to date with changes in legislation.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and sharing information with them to promote continuity in children's learning.
- The childminder understands how to implement the early years foundation stage requirements. She knows how to plan activities to meet children's needs and interests.
- The childminder understands the importance of regularly monitoring children's progress. She explains how she would use this information to support children's continuing development.
- The childminder understands how to help children lead healthy lifestyles, develop their social skills and emotional well-being. She explains the importance of teaching children about having a healthy diet, doing physical exercise and showing respect to others.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
