Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not maintained her paediatric first-aid qualification as required, by allowing it to lapse. This is a breach of the requirements for the Childcare Register.
- The childminder does not have appropriate fire detection and control equipment in place that is in good working order, with particular regard to smoke detectors, fire blankets and extinguishers. This breach also relates to the requirements of the Childcare Register.
- The childminder has knowledge of child protection issues, including the procedures to follow to report any welfare concerns.
- The childminder knows how to provide a range of age-appropriate experiences for children, to help them make progress across all areas of their learning.
- The childminder recognises the importance of maintaining partnerships with parents and to share information regularly, to promote continuity in children's learning and care.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:

The childminder registered in 2005. She lives in Hornchurch, in the London Borough of Havering. The childminder provides care during weekdays and operates all year round. There were no children in the early years age group on roll at the time of the inspection.
