Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibilities in meeting the requirements and how to use required policies and procedures to support children's welfare. She is reflective of her practice and continues to attend training to keep her knowledge updated.
- The childminder recognises how to encourage children to develop positive attitudes to healthy lifestyles and support their good health and emotional and physical well-being.
- The childminder understands children's development and knows how to identify their next steps of learning and monitor their achievements. She knows how to provide activities to motivate children's learning, help them progress and prepare for school.
- The childminder recognises the importance of forming partnerships with parents and other involved professionals to provide continuity for children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands safeguarding issues and procedures to follow any concern arising. She knows how to assess risks in the home and keep children safe on outings.
- The childminder knows how to use behaviour management strategies to boost children's self-confidence and help them learn how to share and be kind to others.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed the childminder's understanding of the early years foundation stage requirements.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's understanding of children's development and the educational programmes she intends to deliver.
- The inspector checked suitability documents and the childminder's first aid certificate.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the home to be used for childminding and discussed safety arrangements.
- The inspector sampled required documentation and discussed how the childminder would use these to support children's well-being.
