Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has an understanding of child protection issues and procedures should she have a concern about children's safety and welfare.
- The childminder knows how to evaluate her practice to develop her childminding service, professional development and children's care.
- The childminder knows how to obtain useful information about children's individual needs and backgrounds to ensure their needs are met and promote inclusion.
- The childminder understands the importance of developing positive relationships with parents. She recognises the benefits of sharing information about children's progress to promote continuity in children's ongoing learning.
- The childminder knows how to support children's learning through play based experiences given their starting points. She is knowledgeable about undertaking observation and assessments to support children's development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had discussions with the childminder about her knowledge of the safeguarding and welfare requirements, and how she supports children's learning and development.
- The inspector sampled documentation including policies and procedures.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's processes for self-evaluation, suitability procedures, children's observation and assessments records and the learning programme for all children.
- The inspector held discussion about the toys and resources available to support children's play and learning.
