## Summary of key findings for parents

## The provision meets requirements

- The childminder is aware of the importance of helping children to develop respect for each other and build good relationships. She knows how to support children to be independent, whilst gaining skills to help them to prepare for school.
- The childminder knows how to help safeguard children's welfare. She is aware of child protection issues and the correct procedures to follow if she has concerns. The childminder knows how to provide a safe environment for children.
- The childminder recognises the benefits of sharing information with parents and other professionals to help her meet children's individual needs.
- The childminder knows how to evaluate her provision and understands the importance of keeping up to date with changes to improve her practice.
- The childminder provides a welcoming environment that is well resourced to promote children's learning.
- The childminder knows how to assess children's play and achievements and plan a range of challenging activities according to their interests. She understands how to monitor children's progress and development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
