- The childminder understands the importance of checking the environment daily and minimising all potential hazards.
- The childminder understands how to engage parents in their children's learning. She has plans in place to work with parents and any relevant professionals closely.
- The childminder knows how to meet the individual needs of children. She intends to complete regular observations and assessments. This information will be used to engage the children in meaningful activities.
- The childminder knows how to promote the importance of healthy lifestyles with the children. She plans to develop daily opportunities for children to be outside in the fresh air and benefiting from exercise.
- The childminder has a good understanding of safeguarding procedures. She is knowledgeable about the signs and symptoms of abuse and know what steps to take to report any concerns she may have.
- The childminder intends to offer children a welcoming environment to enable their confidence and self-esteem to grow. The childminder has a good range of resources and equipment for children to easily access to promote their independence.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation.
