Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands child protection procedures. She knows what to do should concerns arise about a child's welfare.
- Since the last inspection, the childminder has taken steps to develop her understanding of the learning and development requirements. She knows how to use assessment to plan activities to support children to make progress, in readiness for school.
- The childminder keeps her knowledge up to date. For example, she uses professional development opportunities to build on her knowledge and skills.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working with parents to provide a consistent approach to children's care and learning.
- The childminder knows how to support children's understanding of leading healthy lifestyles. She carries out risk assessments of her home every day to identify and minimise hazards.
- The childminder understands how to support children's positive behaviour and independence.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed the premises and resources that the childminder intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder to explore her understanding of the early years foundation stage requirements.
- The inspector looked at relevant documentation, including a selection of policies and procedures.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's self-evaluation and professional development.
- The inspector held discussions to establish the childminder's knowledge of teaching, learning and assessment.

The childminder registered in 2012. She lives in Chesham, Buckinghamshire. The childminder provides care all year round from 7.30am to 6pm, Monday to Friday, except for bank holidays and family holiday. At the time of the inspection, there were no early years children present.
