## Summary of key findings for parents

**The provision does not meet requirements**

- The childminder does not maintain her first-aid qualification. This breach also relates to the Childcare Register.
- The childminder does not hold valid public liability insurance. This breach also relates to the Childcare Register.
- The childminder understands her responsibilities to deliver the learning and development requirements to help children make progress towards the early learning goals.
- The childminder knows the procedures to follow that safeguard children's welfare. She understands how to manage children's behaviour to promote their well-being.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents. She reflects on her practice.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
