## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision does not meet requirements

- The provider has not completed all necessary checks for all people living in her home. This also breaches the Childcare Register requirements.
- The childminder has attended recent safeguarding training. She knows the procedures to follow if she has a concern about a child in her care.
- The childminder understands the importance of ongoing professional development. For example, she carries out reading to maintain her professional knowledge and keeps up to date with changes in legislation.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of the learning and development requirements. She knows how she will identify children's starting points and how to use these, along with her observations and assessments, to plan for children's future learning. She understands the importance of partnerships with parents and knows how to engage them in their children's learning.
- The childminder knows how to support and challenge children in all areas of their learning to help them make progress, and to prepare them to be ready for school.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of her role in helping children build strong relationships. She knows to teach them to share, take turns and to respect each other.
- The childminder understands the importance of supporting children to develop healthy lifestyles. For example, she knows to provide children with healthy meals and snacks.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
