## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The provider understands her responsibilities to safeguard children. She ensures all staff know the procedures to follow should they be concerned about a child's welfare, and uses robust recruitment procedures to ensure all staff are suitable.
- The provider understands how to promote the learning and development of all children. She is aware of ensuring staff know how to observe and assess children's progress and to use this information to plan for their next steps in learning.
- The provider ensures staff keep their knowledge up to date to improve outcomes for children. She is aware of using self-evaluation to support continuous improvement.
- The provider understands the importance of working in partnerships with parents and in keeping them involved in their children's learning.
- The provider ensures staff know how to support children's personal development and how to positively manage their behaviour, including how to be kind and respect others.
- The provider knows the importance of promoting children's health through regular exercise and a healthy diet.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector talked with the provider about how she expects staff to deliver the requirements.
- The inspector discussed the nursery's policies and the documents that the staff intend to use when caring for children.
- The inspector looked at the spaces, resources and equipment available in the nursery.

Ilys Booker Centre registered in 1993. It is located in North Kensington in the London Borough of Kensington and Chelsea. At the time of the inspection, there were no children on roll in the early years age range. The centre is currently only operating as a drop-in group for families each week day from 10am to 1pm, term time only. The centre currently employs two staff who both hold appropriate early years qualifications.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
