The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has appropriately addressed actions raised at the time of the last inspection. These link to planning for children's future learning. The childminder provides documentation that shows changes were made to her practice following the inspection.
- The childminder demonstrates through discussion and documentation that she is aware of the learning and development requirements.
- The childminder identifies guidance documents that she plans to consult to aid her in ensuring that children are challenged successfully so that they make progress.
- In discussion, the childminder demonstrates a sound knowledge of what would cause her concern and her responsibilities to protect children from abuse and neglect.
- The childminder identifies and successfully minimises potential risks in her home and garden.
- The childminder provides appropriate toys and activities that meet the needs of children at different stages of development.
- The childminder recognises the value of working in partnership with parents.

 Documentation initially completed by parents, includes good detail on their child's care needs.
- In discussion, the childminder explains how she ensures that children are made aware of expectations for behaviour. She says that children learn to share and take turns.
- Detail on the service provided for parents and children is identified in a range of policies and procedures.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
