- The childminder understands how to use her knowledge of child development to help them make progress. She knows how to use her observations of children's play to plan interesting activities to support their learning, ready for their move to school.
- The childminder prioritises safeguarding and keeps her training refreshed. She understands how to deal with any concerns regarding children's welfare.
- The childminder's home is welcoming and well equipped. The childminder understands the importance of children leading their own learning and making choices about their play.
- The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour to help them learn to share, take turns and be respectful of each other.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's well-being. She understands why children should learn about healthy eating, personal hygiene routines and exercise.
- The childminder understands the importance of working effectively with parents and other settings children may attend, to complement and reinforce their learning.
- The childminder knows the importance of evaluating her practice, to help identify her strengths and areas for development. She knows to gain the views of parents and children in the process.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
