The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and others to promote continuity of care for children.
- The childminder knows how to recognise and report concerns about children's welfare.
- The childminder understands how to assess children's learning and development and how to use this information to plan for further learning experiences.
- The childminder holds a current paediatric first aid certificate. She has robust policies and procedures to help her to keep children safe, and knows how to risk assess resources and environments to ensure they remain safe for children to use.
- The childminder knows how to talk to children to help them understand how to behave well and to keep themselves safe from harm.
- The childminder values the views of others and knows how to self-evaluate to identify areas for continuous improvement.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
