## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has improved her knowledge of the learning and development requirements following the previous inspection. For example, she is aware of how to monitor children's progress and plan for their individual learning needs.
- The childminder understands how to use her environment and resources to extend children's interests. She knows how to ensure children have uninterrupted time to learn through play and to provide many different experiences, such as playing with natural objects and other materials.
- The childminder is knowledgeable about how to support children's understanding of good values, such as using manners and sharing resources. She understands how to help children value their own and other peoples' differences and similarities.
- The childminder recognises the importance of evaluating her practice continuously. She uses her thorough assessment to improve the effectiveness of her provision.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she delivers the educational programmes for children when they are present.
- The inspector looked at relevant policies and documents that the childminder uses when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her self-evaluation processes and improvement plan.
