- Staff know how to plan for a good range of engaging and exciting learning activities that reflect the children's interests and needs.
- The staff understand the importance of helping children to develop respect and build good relationships. They know how to promote children's independence to help them prepare for school.
- The club provides a healthy menu and are aware of how to promote children's awareness of healthy lifestyles. The setting provides children with healthy snacks, meals and opportunities for children to be physically active.
- The club maintains an effective self-assessment process to improve the staffs' knowledge, understanding and expertise. The manager and staff have made improvements following the recommendations from the previous inspection.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. Early Birds @ West Grove Primary School out of school provision registered in 2005. It operates from West Grove Primary School in Southgate, in the London Borough of Enfield. During term times a breakfast club is provided from 7.30am to 8.55am and the after school club runs from 3.15pm to 6pm, Monday to Friday. The setting also provides a holiday club during some of the school holidays from 8am to 6pm. There are seven staff employed to work with the children, five of whom hold relevant childcare qualifications. There were no children on roll at the time of the inspection.
