Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not ensured she obtains a relevant first-aid qualification and does not hold valid public liability insurance. These are also breaches of the Childcare Register.
- The childminder does not ensure she keeps her knowledge up to date to fulfil all aspects of her role and responsibilities and improve the quality of her provision. For example, she lacks understanding of current changes in legislation to safeguard children's welfare.
- The childminder recognises the signs that may indicate a child is at risk of harm and knows how to report any welfare concerns.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's good health and physical well-being. She understands how to encourage children to behave positively.
- The childminder understands how to provide a range of activities to promote children's learning and development, and to help them make good progress.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents to support children's care and learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

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What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:
